\$150 to "The Women's Center" Purpose: Fund for Baby Eliana Comment: Members of the Northwest Families for Life demonstrate every Thursday at Forest View Clinic, an abortion mill in Des Plaines, and try to persuade women, seeking an abortion, against killing their unborn babies. Most times their efforts are ignored, 6 to 15 unborn babies are killed there each week; but every so often, a miracle occurs and a Forest View client Chooses Life because of the efforts of NWFL and The Women's Center. Such was the case, last December, and beautiful Eliana was born on July 12th. Her mother Veronica, has two children and is separated from her husband. She has very little money for rent, clothes and food, but she does have a beautiful 6 pound, 9 ounce miracle baby who needs food clothes and diapers.
