Spiritual works of mercy

- To instruct the ignorant. In other words, help people understand and learn about God, their faith and their role as a Christian Catholics.
- *Counsel the doubtful.* Give good advice to those who are uncertain about what is expected and give useful direction. Live the Gospel in word and deed.
- Admonish sinners. Help people who sin to understand how it hurts them and others and how to live God's love by being good examples.
- Bear wrongs patiently. Deal both forgivingly and kindly with people who do thoughtless things.
- Forgive offenses willingly. Forgive people who cause pain, even if they don't deserve it, for this is a true act of mercy.

Comfort the suffering. Reach out to those who are having a tough time. Instead of trying to "fix" the problem, be present to them. Just as **"shared joy is doubled,"** by being present to those most in need, **"shared sorrow is halved."**
