State of the Art high school band competition (\$100.00): Requested by Michael Ferreter Knights of Columbus have chaired and shepherded this program since its beginning at Driscoll High School in Addison in 1981. This program receives support from Councils and Assemblies throughout the Chicago area. It is a cooperative between the Knights of Columbus State of the Art Committee, the High School Band Directors, and the Band Parents Club of the host school. In addition, the Columbia magazine editors recognized the uniqueness of this youth program with a featured article in the September 2013 issue. It provides a forum for Catholic high school music students to experience performing concert music in competition. Each of the 18 to 20 bands is a group of 25 to 110 young men and women who dedicate many hours of practice to learn to play the best concert band music. The 36th annual competition will be held at Marian Catholic High School at 700 Ashland Ave in Chicago Heights on Saturday February 20, 2016. The one-day all-day event starts at 8:30 am and ends when the trophies and plaques are presented at 6 pm. Our own St. Viator High School band is this year's defending champion. Background from the Thomas More Society:

The National Abortion Federation (NAF) and Planned Parenthood have both filed federal -RICO- (racketeering) lawsuits against David Daleiden and the Center for Medical Progress in an attempt to silence free speech on the abortion industry's sale of fetal body parts.

The Thomas More Society brings years of experience to defending these cases. The Society was formed back in 1997 in order to continue the marathon efforts of its founding attorney, Tom Brejcha, to defend against the abortion industry's earlier effort to use RICO against the pro-life movement in NOW v. Scheidler, a national class action lawsuit. NOW v. Scheidler was prosecuted in Chicago from 1986 until 2014 when the Society won the case definitively after 28 years and three trips to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Contributing a dedicated defense to David Daleiden, Thomas More Society attorneys have been working around the clock, as well as travelling back and forth from Chicago to San Francisco (where the lawsuits are taking place) and Texas, where Daleiden was recently indicted. Please keep this case in your prayers!
