BUNCO NIGHT For LADIES and GENTLEMEN

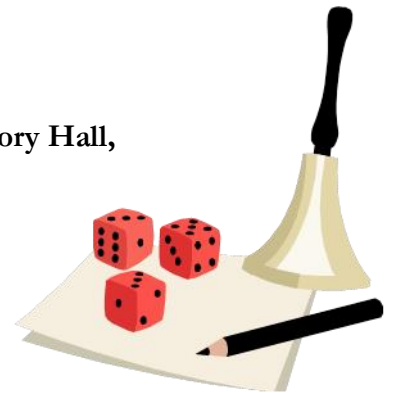
The Holy Rosary Ladies Auxiliary of the Knights of Columbus invites all women, men and their friends to join us for a BUNCO party on
