Many of us look back on our education with fond memories. One memory that comes to mind, was the entrance of a substitute teacher. Pity the poor substitute teacher who feels insecure. When a nervous sub enters a classroom the students will sense it, and chaos is likely to break out. On the other hand, pity the students when a teacher is authoritarian, lording it over them just because he or she can. What students are looking for is someone with true authority, whose authority comes from an *inner certainty* rather than a need to look good. 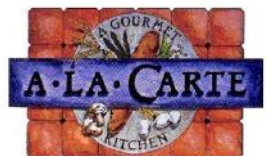
