Chaplain's Report

"Lord, make me an instrument of your peace." This is the first line to one of the best-loved and most widely known prayers of all time. It is recognized around the world, and is familiar even to those who are not Christian. Here is the popular prayer:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace.

Where there is hatred, let me bring love.

Where there is offense, let me bring pardon.

Where there is discord, let me bring union.

Where there is error, let me bring truth.

Where there is doubt, let me bring faith.

Where there is despair, let me bring hope.

Where there is darkness, let me bring your light.

Where there is sadness, let me bring joy.

O Master, let me not seek as much

to be consoled as to console,

to be understood as to understand,

to be loved as to love,

for it is in giving that one receives,

it is in pardoning that one is pardoned,

it is in dying that one is raised to eternal life.



But there is more to the mysterious history of this beloved prayer. Many people believe that it was written by St. Francis of Assisi. His life so perfectly exemplifies its charism that he may as well have written it. It almost seems imbued with the humble, simple, radiant heart of Francis himself. His name is inseparable from the opening line:

"Lord, make me an instrument of your peace..."

However, St. Francis was not the author of this renowned prayer. With careful research and study, the prayer was found to have first been printed in a Catholic magazine called La Clochette in 1912. Father Esther Bouquerel (1855–1923) was the editor of this magazine. With rare exceptions, all the content was written by him. It seems, then, that if he himself was the writer, he wished to remain anonymous. Around the year 1918, a Franciscan priest named Étienne Benoît reprinted this prayer on a holy card with a picture of St. Francis and had it mass-produced.

This, then, must have been what confused everyone about its author. It reached the United States by 1927. When it was published in English, a Quaker magazine misattributed it to St. Francis of Assisi. During World War II, Archbishop Francis Spellman helped distribute "millions of copies of" this prayer, still attributed to St. Francis.

"One can safely say," comments a friar, "that although [St. Francis] is not the author, it resembles him and would not have displeased him." This prayer is so beloved that it has been set to music numerous times. When you hear the words "Lord, make me an instrument of your peace," you probably start humming a certain tune in your head! Below is a prayer which St. Francis did write. A prayer for peace, a prayer which is similar to the "Peace Prayer" in its humility, love, and spirit of sacrifice.

St. Francis prayed this in front of the San Damiano cross.

"Most high, Most Glorious God, Enlighten the darkness of my heart. Grant me a right and true faith, a certain hope, and a perfect charity, a feeling, and understanding of You, So that I may be able to accomplish your holy and just commands. Amen."

(St. Francis of Assisi, 1206)


