Chaplain's Report

With the surprising news of Our Holy Father, BENEDICT XVI, retiring from the leadership of our church, I am reminded of the many ways in which he influenced and modeled for us, the position of leadership and stewardship for the church.

At the beginning of my discernment for the diaconate, I was still working. During this time I was traveling to the Netherlands to visit one of our offices, and I was looking for something to occupy my time on the 8 hour flight. I'm not sure why at this time but, I copied ***DEUS CARITAS EST (God is Love)*** to read during the flight. Now this was first written by the Holy Father in 2005, and it still holds significant meaning for me. We are told during our diaconate formation that discernment does not end with ordination, and so each day we make a conscious decision to live our life in Christ.

One of the many ways in which we do this, both as clergy and lay persons, is through stewardship and ministry. By the selfless giving of our time, talents and treasures, we make life more purposeful for our brothers and sisters, and for those most in need of God's love. But, with so many in need, and so little time and resources, we can sometimes find ourselves discouraged or frustrated by our inability to satisfy everyone's needs.

But, we should never tire from doing what is good and needed. It is in ***DEUS CARITAS EST (God is Love)*** where I found my call to service and, where Our Holy Father, BENEDICT XVI, wrote;

"The one who serves does not consider himself superior to the one served, however miserable his situation at the moment may be. Christ took the lowest place in the world—the Cross—and by this radical humility he redeemed us and constantly comes to our aid. Those who are in a position to help others will realize that in doing so they themselves receive help; being able to help others is no merit or achievement of their own. This duty is a grace. The more we do for others, the more we understand and can appropriate the words of Christ: "We are useless servants" (Lk 17:10). We recognize that we are not acting on the basis of any superiority or greater personal efficiency, but because the Lord has graciously enabled us to do so. There are times when the burden of need and our own limitations might tempt us to become discouraged. But precisely then we are helped by the knowledge that, in the end, we are only instruments in the Lord's hands; and this knowledge

frees us from the presumption of thinking that we alone are personally responsible for building a better world. In all humility we will do what we can, and in all humility we will entrust the rest to the Lord. It is God who governs the world, not we. We offer him our service only to the extent that we can, and for as long as he grants us the strength. To do all we can with what strength we have, however, is the task which keeps the good servant of Jesus Christ always at work: "The love of Christ urges us on" (2 Cor 5:14).

This call to service is as important today as it was, at this first writing. It is God who gives us the strength, and desire to place ourselves in servitude to his church and his people.

Let us all pray for the College of Cardinals and for the gift of the Holy Spirit in their discernment and, election of our new Pope, as we pray for him, "***The Lord preserve him and give him life, and make him blessed upon the earth, and deliver him not to the will of his enemies***".

Prior to returning to his hometown of Chicago, he was the Sales and Marketing Director for the Catholic Cemeteries of the Archdiocese of Omaha.

Glenn was ordained a permanent Deacon in 1991. During his period of diaconal formation, he earned a Graduate Degree in Church Ministry from Creighton University in Omaha.

He is married to his wife of 48 years Lucille; they have two daughters, one son and two grandsons.
