PROPOSED CHANGES TO OUR CHARITY BY-LAWS

At the July 11 business meeting the following changes to our Holy Rosary Charity Committee (HRCC) will be voted on:

Presently

2.3 Conflict of Interest - Members of the HRCC with the exception of the DGK will hold no other elected office within Holy Rosary Council.

Proposed

2.3 Conflict of Interest - Members of the HRCC may consist of any council member with the exception of the Financial Secretary and the following elected officers: Chancellor, Warden, Treasurer, Trustees and Recording Secretary. However, if a HRCC committee member is unable to fulfill his appointed term for any reason, the Grand Knight may appoint an inside or outside guard to a maximum period of one year to fill the vacated position for the purpose of the inside or outside guard obtaining additional council experience prior to moving up in the chairs.

Presently

3.1 Holy Rosary Council Charity Fund - Charitable monies do not need to be maintained in a separate bank account and may be mixed with the general council funds. However the Council will consider any monies collected or donated to the council for charitable purposes as part of a charitable reserve which will commonly be called or known as the "Charity Fund."

Proposed

3.1 Holy Rosary Council Charity Fund - Charity Funds may include monies received from "Poker Nights" and "Other Sources". "Poker Night" monies are defined as monies collected under the Illinois Charitable Game Act, kept in a separate bank account and not commingled with the general council monies.

Per the Illinois Charitable Games Act -230 ILCS 30, Section 8- " The entire net proceeds from charitable games must be exclusively devoted to the lawful purposes of the organization permitted to conduct that game." Therefore, donations (distributions) are to be made in accordance with the advancement of the goals and purposes of the Knights of Columbus, Holy Rosary Council 4483.

Monies from "Other Sources"; examples include a pancake breakfasts, fish fries, respect life donations or a gift made in memory of another person. These contributions or bequests may be mixed with the general council funds. However, a separate line item

as shown in the budget and known as the "Good of the Order Donations" will be maintained.
