#### Matthew Kelly writes;

The problem is that we are inconsistent at grasping the moments of the day, one by one for God. If we feel like praying we pray and, if we don't feel like praying we don't pray. The problem with this approach is that, if we link our love of God is

dictated by our selfish feelings, and then obviously there is a contradiction, love being selfless. God calls us not only to prayer but to <u>consistent prayer</u>. The more consistency we can bring to our prayer life, the more consistent our response to God will be in the moments of our days.

May God bless the work of our hands, "*Lord grant us salvation, Lord grant us success"* (Psalm 118:25).
