Greetings Brother Knights:

The ID Drive is behind us. As of October 15, 2013, our goal, as set by

State, was \$16,757.98. We collected \$17,923.36 which does not include the Jewel register totals which we have not yet received from State. We exceeded our goal by \$1,165.38. Total expenses totaled \$1,938.74 (\$1,365.00 was the cost of the Tootsie Rolls). The Jewel figures will be added to our 2013 gross income.

The Parishes will receive the amounts collected after Masses on September 14-15. The site/intersection collections will benefit Clearbrook, Marklund, Misericordia, Glenkirk, Arlington Heights Committee for Disabilities, NAMI, Miner School, Resources for Community Living, and FOCIT.


