We are happy to share this account of our recent **Walk for Life West Coast 2015** which took place in San Francisco on Saturday, January 24, 2015.

We were blessed to meet many great pro-life folks at the **Walk for Life West Coast 2015.** To begin our day, we walked with the *LIFErunners.org*. This group included the LIFE runners founder Dr. Pat Castle, retired Air Force Lieutenant Colonel. The runners (and walkers) met at the Golden Gate Park at 7:30 am for a 5K race. Pat Castle, Ph.D, was also recently named the new President of Vitae Foundation working to make abortion unthinkable. Vitae is a multi-million dollar not-for-profit media organization founded by Carl Landwehr who after 22 years passed the baton to Pat Castle. Pat is is also a Knight of Columbus. At the LIFE runners 5K we also met Sandy from Seattle representing *HEALING THE CULTURE*, an educational institute promoting greater respect for human life. The co-founders of *HEALING THE CULTURE* are Camille Pauley and Fr. Robert Spitzer. Fr. Spitzer has authored two books on life issues and has been a world-recognized defender of the sanctity of life for over 25 years (featured on EWTN). This organization offers dynamic Respect Life education for teens: flexible and easy to use resources that teach core principles of logic, ethics, and justice. Programs and retreats for adults as well.

We were honored to represent the Holy Rosary Council #4483 banner at this Walk for Life. Approximately 50,000 attended. See photos attached.

Note: A week before the Walk for Life West Coast in San Francisco, approximately 15,000 !!! attended the first annual OneLifeLA on January 17. It began at the historic LaPlacita on Olvera Street where the crowds began a walk through downtown past the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels.
